An agreement was then presented & signed as follows: We, the undersigned hereby pledge ourselves as active members of a stock-growers association to be this day organized, with the views for the purposes here expressed, R. B. Curtis, Chas. Ancey, Peter Le Beau, Eli Manderville, Joe Viary, W. W. Curtis, Railey Bros., S. P. Gaskill, H. C. Cockhill, Walcott, Curtis, Irvine, B. Hopkins, Henry, Neely, Jas. A. Harris, J. H. Nixon & C. Regli.

The following permanent officers were then elected. President - Chas. Ancey. Vice President - Peter Le Beau. Secretary - H. C. Cockhill. Treasurer - Walcott Curtis.

On motion, the chair appointed the following executive committee; R. B. Curtis, H. P. Railey, J. H. Nixon, Irvine, B. Hopkins & H. Harris.

Selection of arbitration committee deferred to next meeting. Constitution & by laws adopted.

Secretary instructed to have copies of constitution, &c. printed & send to members & other stock-growers in district.

Adjourned to meet at Hamilton, on Saturday, April 2, 1887, at which time all persons interested are invited to be present. H. C. Cockhill, Secy.

### Constitution

Art. 1. This Association formed under & in conformity with the Constitution of the Territorial Association, shall be known as the Stock Growers Association of Hamilton District, Gallatin County, Mont.

Art. 2. That any person engaged in raising & dealing in cattle or horses shall be eligible to membership.

Art. 3. The officers of the Association shall consist of a President, Vice-president, Secretary & Treasurer, together with an Executive Committee & a Committee of Arbitration; also with one or more Delegates.

Art. 4. The officers shall be elected by ballot where

- there are two or more candidates for the same office, a majority of votes shall elect. Where but one candidate is named the election may be made by the call of yeas & nays, & the officers shall hold office for the term of one year, unless removed or otherwise disqualified. When a successor may be elected by the Association.
- Art. 5. The fee of Membership shall be five dollars annually. Each person seeking Membership shall sign these Articles of Organization, & pledge himself or herself to answer all calls of the Association for assistance or information, & the funds of which shall be used as follows, to-wit: One dollar for each member shall go to the Territorial Association, annually, & the balance shall be used for the expenses of the Association.
- Art. 6. The duties of the President shall be to preside at all meetings of the Association, call special meetings at any time & place, when & where the interest of the Association requires, sign all orders on the Treasurer, & in general watch over the interest of the Association.
- The duties of the Vice-President shall be to act in the absence or inability of the President.
- The duties of the Secretary shall be to keep a complete record of all meetings, notify members in arrears for dues, collect the same, receive all monies due the Association from members or otherwise, paying the same to the Treasurer & taking his receipt therefor, conduct correspondence with other County, District, or Territorial Associations, & act as Clerk, & shall be the Executive of the Committee of Administration in general perform all the duties required pertaining to his office.
- The duties of the Treasurer shall be to

keep a strict account of all monies collected & expended by him, & report the same to the Executive Committee, at least quarterly, in a neat & comprehensive balance sheet.

The duties of the Executive Committee shall be to audit all bills or accounts, have the general superintendence of the Association, act for it when in their judgment emergencies occur & direct & control the movements of the Detectives.

The duties of the Committee of Arbitration shall be to hear, try & determine the equal rights of all members in matters of dispute relating to stock matters; but no member shall sit upon his own case. The Executive Committee shall appoint another member in his stead. Each litigant can state his own case & furnish his own evidence, & all decisions shall be rendered within one week after adjournment of the Court of Arbitration.

The duties of the Detectives shall be governed by the Executive Committee, & they shall be paid by the Association the sum of \$ . per month each, & they shall make written reports to the Clerk of the Executive Committee as often as possible, & at least once a month.

The duties of the Association, through their Executive Committee shall be to pay all expenses contracted by parties sent by the Committee after shayed or stolen stock, or any expenses incurred in the prosecution of any claims for members by the Association under or by the law.

Art. 7. The fee paid for arbitration shall not be less than five dollars nor more than twenty; five dollars in any one case, & shall be assessed equally to the parties in the case,

All such fees shall be turned into the treasury of the Association.

Art. 8. No member shall refuse to give testimony before the Committee of Arbitration when notified that his evidence is required, & of the time & place of meeting, on pain of expulsion, without satisfactory explanation of such refusal.

Art. 9. All members are required to forward to the Secretary of this & the Territorial Association a fac simile of their marks & brands, with their post office address & location of range, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary of both Territorial & County Association.

By Laws.

Art. 1. That the Officers & Executive Committee shall constitute the Board of Directors of the Association & each shall be entitled to one vote at their meetings, & a majority shall constitute a quorum to transact business.

Art. 2. At all meetings of the Association or Board of Directors, the President shall take the chair, or in his absence the Vice President; or, in their absence, a President-pro-tem may be appointed by those present at the meeting.

Art. 3. The rules of parliamentary proceedings (Jefferson Manual) shall prevail in all meetings of the Board or of the Association, except as may otherwise be provided by these By-Laws.

Art. 4. The yeas & nays upon any question may be called for & entered upon the minutes at the request of any two members, & the previous question may be ordered by the vote of the majority present.

Art. 5. The Order of Business shall be:

1. Roll Call.

2. Reading the minutes of the preceding meeting.

Art 6. The Board of Directors shall appoint, annually such Standing Committees as they may deem necessary, & such Special Committees as the exigencies of business may require at any time.

Art 7. Absence from roll call at meetings of the Board shall subject the absentee to a fine of fifty cents, but may be remitted by the Board for good cause, & absence from the monthly meeting of the Association, at roll call, will subject the absentee to a fine of twenty five cents, unless remitted by the Executive Committee for good cause shown.

Art 8. These By-Laws may be amended or altered by a two-thirds vote of the Board of Directors or the majority of the members present at the meeting.

Art 9. It shall be the duty of every member of this Association, whenever he shall find any stock ranging in his vicinity belonging to any other member of this or any other Association, to report the same to the Secretary of the Association of which he is a member, giving the marks & brands on the animal so found, when the Secretary shall search the records for the owner & communicate the same to him.

Art 10. And it shall be the duty of each member to so far himself as to mark & brand as to know all at least that belong to the members of this Association.
