few lines to you; I spent the day

Brok; In the AM she took the 4 o'clock  
Train with the children & went to  
her new home at Old Mission; soon  
as the boats are running she will  
be over after her bed & things she  
had here; Tell you it makes a big  
road way here & quite a space at the  
table as well as quiet to Laura—

Mr. Hunt & Grace have Moved in  
Mr. Gays Old house near his Mother  
She expects to be confined next Month  
Owen & the boys are cutting wood for  
summer It looks good down there;  
think of home every thing puts me  
in mind of former days, I do not see  
any of Gays folks; in fact the snow has  
filled the roads untill now that most  
every one had to or did stay at home;  
it does seem good to see the ground  
bare & this nice weather; Seel & his  
Mother went Town & got a new Plough  
looks like business will start in to  
plow for his field Peas; have not heard  
from G in a long time; nor any others —  
Mrs Sherman come & spent the afternoon  
with me but Anna was gone but came  
just before she started home; 2 or 3  
days ago Mrs Lowell Lewis came  
but as usual I was alone all afternoon  
She left just before Anna came —

Mrs Goddeard came 2 weeks ago  
to day on foot & alone stayed all  
day & left as she came; Our cows  
are nearly dry Anna has made  
better all last winter - yet she will  
not have any New Milk Cows until  
late in summer; I dont hear a word  
from Jennie nor Tim lately

Our Papers (The News) have stopped  
coming we miss them) Sacra has  
watched & waited so long for a letter  
she is sure you are mad at her  
She was so pleased with those  
Pictures; they are nice & pretty  
I do hope to goodness you will write  
soon, sick or no sick;  
from your anxious Mother

Eth Rapids Thurs July 21<sup>st</sup> - 1892

My Dear Mary reform long expected came late last evening been in the Office 3 days; I was waiting to hear from you beside I was so sick he writing about feel like it to sleep I am better than I was best now

hand trembles so weak it is nice growing weather every thing looks so nice the boys have men handling in hay to day. Laura is turning the work on the farm. I cant see how she stands it. She is young & looks old; it makes me feel bad for her no one here takes the work & care off from her. She is laying by a big crop of hay wheat looks splendid & like every bodies near ripe she has 10 acres to harvest she has 13<sup>rd</sup> in sacks finished have not been out only to Mr Goddard's once; I am going round to Mrs Gage before Matilda returns home. They all Mrs Guy & Matilda come & spent 2 hours with me & Anna was away rode down & they walked back a wonder if thing for sure & she was never in this house before or wrote to a good place for fruit as she has a good variety & plenty of it I dont hear a word from Lucy — I have not been in Town since I came Mr & Mrs Mcleaplin came last Sunday a short time. She has her Father with her & the word is he is crazy or out of his mind each should you speak of sending a hold team or 2 Laura left her husband & room to me it is a large nice one if I have 3 quarters one & Mathilda would suit me better. But I am all right as it is; Only a smaller one would give me more room, I cant write worth a cent, I am glad you sent some one of the Pictures; But I think they are horrid as they all reek as I never wear my hair in that form nor cant I dress up afternoons in my clean apron & neck tie

Sanna is crazy to go for Bleekle berries up on the Board  
man comes he gone 2 days & I will let she comes home  
Sick & spent one day at Marsh James; every thing  
looks lovely growing fields corn potatoes garden  
clean no weeds or bugs to be seen. Many had come  
a large quantity of strawberries & made full while  
I was there; they had picked all the berries but she &  
Charlie got out enough for our dinner & supper -  
boys are good boys don't boister & feel tired they are  
steerly with Owen & their home shows it; Many has  
changed in her mode of house keeping does far better  
than she did; Grace is science Buff maker in Town  
has all she can do; I saw her once the 4th she went to  
her work had so much promised works around  
she is a very pretty girl of 20 years & is so well spo  
of by every one; Kate is nursing her fallen yet but  
its getting better slowly - Sanna is the smartest &  
on this ranch goes on spring heels every time -  
never tires until she is done; The others take this  
My cough is near broke up & am better -

I kept waiting  
to hear from you before I wrote; I do hope some of you  
will come here this summer; Jennie wrote me Tim  
could come after I had left came on horseback part way  
then horegat a buck board & harness & came on stayed 2 days  
then she went to Palmer's lake with (that is half way) to  
headent on the lake down on the lens; Tim had the mil  
little more she ever seen; he did not want her to leave  
house to go in that rough place; if she had known that she  
would not let me go away that all right now

1874 Gilpin St Denver Colo Dec 9th 1889

Dear Mary I do not feel like writing this morning but will say enough to let you know I am all right living. I have had spells & even all day <sup>some days</sup> you need not be surprised to hear I have dropped off & left this trouble some time. It has been some time since I heard from you but I know the cares & anxieties you have with your large family I know is a continual strain in your mind. What has become of Benj I have been wondering why does he not go to his own home; A man in a strange city no home no business to be doing is terrible - This City is overflowed with just such & they find poor picking for they get snatched up & are sent to jail or leave town, how I wish Benj was at home I wrote to Sam about it & she has not written since, she does not want him home as that puts a blot on much of her doings it's no use troubling myself yet I can't help it, I love my dear Benj with all his faults I love him still, since Bee came in we have had long pleasant days - Sheets dry & dusty yesterday went to church except Jim left him asleep, all as Jim has a young woman staying here to be confined in Feb; she is doing the work at present she is 18 years old & her husband left her - so Jim picked her up, she does the cooking & that gives Jim a good chance to go out which she improves nearly every day besides she has a little girl 8 years old going to school now we have 5 in here the other <sup>family</sup>

Last Saturday Jessie took us all down on the  
Cable cars to see the Werner Sand the little woman  
27 years old 10 cent admittance the greatest hour  
I ever went to see as she is nothing more or less than  
the ape kind yet the man her keeper tells his pedigree  
is fair to tell there were also wax figures of  
many of the big heads of England Austria Russia  
& China, also several pictures of each crowd  
of people & it is in every public place even the  
large churches is crammed full, for has just  
got down town to stay all day she goes so much  
yet her is in ample order neat & clean in every spot  
not one expect up from cellar to grand walks  
& yards, also out here is like a table so clean —  
Tim has 15 California Doves in a cage in the  
yard & they have a big family now they have  
their own eggs with out hatching I hope to feel  
better when I write again, we had 2 cats came  
to us a long time ago we pited them & now they  
are both left us which I take as a bad omen  
I work on a fancy desk for Jessie I think  
as Tim's silk one I made last summer  
now with love & best wishes to all & send  
you with kind Gleasons blessing  
Mother Stocking
