Resolved, that the members of this body express and record their profound appreciation of the life and labors brought to a close by the death of the Honorable Thomas H. Carter.

He was a lawyer by profession and acquired the reputation of a great lawyer and a worthy advocate. He entered public life just prior to the admission of Montana as a state and for a quarter of a century was constantly engaged both as a public servant and a private citizen in promoting the welfare of the people of Montana and in laying the foundation of a great and prosperous state.

What he has done for Montana and her people forms a prominent part of the history of this commonwealth.

He was a leader in the United States Senate and a credit to the State he represented. He was able, fearless, companionable and a true friend. His death has left a vacancy which few, if any, can fill, and not only the State of Montana, but the nation as well, has suffered a great loss.
